



FAMILY SHELTER

(EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE) as of August 1, 2011

If your family is in a housing crisis and need to apply for Emergency Assistance (shelter), here are some important things you should know:


- Beginning August 1st, 2011, your family will be helped in a new way.
- To receive assistance, first you must be determined Emergency Assistance (EA)-eligible by a Homeless Coordinator. Eligible families who are homeless and are:
 - ◆ Victim of domestic violence or a natural disaster (e.g. fire, etc.): You will be placed in an EA shelter.
 - ◆ 18 through 21 years of age: You will be placed in an EA congregate shelter or a Teen Living Program.
 - ◆ Risk of homelessness for other reasons (overcrowding, asked to leave, evicted from housing, etc.): You will be referred to a new program called HomeBASE.

WHAT IS THE HomeBASE PROGRAM?

- ◆ The HomeBASE Program offers time-limited assistance designed to provide alternative solutions to families who are at serious risk of homelessness rather than going into a shelter.
- ◆ The type of assistance is based on the individual needs of a family which will be determined through an assessment.
- ◆ There is no guaranteed amount or type of assistance. The new system will be based on your family's needs, situation, and contribution.
